


# **Internet Safety Talk and Survey**

Over 90 responses were received to the survey that was distributed to parents. The responses overwhelmingly show that parents agree that children's use of technology should be restricted both in time spent using the technology and the content that can be accessed.



## STEM PROJECT—Engineering Week

In our January newsletter, we advised that our teacher, Mr. David Tobin on behalf of the school applied for the STEM grant that was announced by the Dept of Education. Over 2,700 schools applied and St. Paul's were one of the lucky 560 school to receive a grant of €10K. From we grant we were able to purse our LEGO project from 1st to 6th class.

We had our first visit form Rob from Learnit on March 4th on our Lego STEM project. Ms. Barron's 6th class and Mr. Carroll's 4th class were the first have an inhouse LEGO workshop.

It will be rolled out throughout the school in Sept from 1st to 6th classes. The project will challenge pupils on critical thinking and problem solving. It focuses on exposing pupils to coding and much more.
